I am directed to refer to the subject cited above
and to say that as per the provisions of Section-32 of your University
Act fee structure is required to be approved by the Government on
receipt of proposal from the University.

2. On receipt of fee structure proposal for the
academic year 2010-2011 from you, the Government on the
recommendation of the fee structure committee has approved the fee
structure of your University as per enclosed Annexure-'A' subject to
the following conditions :-

1. The Government has approved the revised student
intake i.e. Engineering Courses(B.Tech) 360
students (Civil, Mechanical, Elect. Communication,
Computer Science, Electric, Information Technology
60 students each), MBA 60 students, BBA 60
students during the current session 2011-2012.
2. The university shall engage the faculty as per the
norms fixed by the regulatory bodies viz. UGC,
AICTE, BCI, MCI etc.
3. Teaching Staff as per AICTE norms of 1:15 for
proposed courses of B.Tech., BBA and MBA be
provided for starting the first year classes as per
revised intake of students to be submitted.

Wg.

1. The university shall give the details of regular faculty in the prospectus. Further the details of the entire faculty including contract/part time should be available in the official website of the university.
5. The deficiency of the faculty shall be fulfilled atleast one month before start of the course.
6. The infrastructure viz. computers, labs and other equipments shall be provided as per norms of the regulatory bodies and shall be available before the start of course.
7. In case any deficiency is observed at later stage, suitable action as per law shall be initiated against the university.
8. The tuition fee shall be charged annually, in two equal installments.
9. The Institutional Development Charges shall be Rs.10,000/- in each case for every university, to be charged annually.
10. The Caution Money for Hostel will be Rs.5,000/- and for university it will be Rs.10,000/- in each case for every university for the whole programme/course. This fees will be refundable in nature.
11. The university shall charge the fees under the four heads as recommended by the committee and no other fees shall be charged by the university.
12. The university shall remain free to propose the add-on charges for special facilities/activities over and above those included in the list to be provided for specific students on optional basis from time to time, but for any facility which is provided to all the students of a programme there cannot be any add on charges for that.
13. The university will clearly categorize the fees for hostellers and non-hosteller as the case may be and the details thereof as approved by the Govt. shall be given in the prospectus.
14. The university shall encourage and implement all the welfare schemes applicable for the staff as well as students.
15. In no case shall the fee fixed by the committee exceed the proposed fee structure by the university. In case, it is detected it shall be suitably reduced.
16. If the university does not have sufficient faculty and infrastructure for running a course, the university can drop the idea of starting such courses. Further, no

university shall be allowed to start any course except for which the fee has been recommended by the committee.

17. If already charging less than approved tuition fee, same shall be continued. If charging more, excess be refunded.

18. If any university charges more than the fee approved, the Govt. will take action against the university.

19. If any course/degree/programme is not recognized by the UGC for which the fee has been approved the same shall not be deemed as approved.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the subject cited above and to say that as per the provisions of Section-32 of your University Act fee structure is required to be approved by the Government on receipt of proposal from the University.

2. On receipt of fee structure proposal for the academic year 2011-2012 from you, the Government on the recommendation of the fee structure committee has approved the fee structure of your University as per enclosed Annexure-'A' subject to the following conditions :-

1. The Government has approved the fee for the BBA, MBA, BCA and MCA, during the current session 2011-2012. The university shall not start any course except those for which the "course" as well as the "fees" has been approved by the Government for the year 2011-12.
2. The university shall engage the faculty as per the norms fixed by the regulatory bodies viz. UGC, AICTE, BCI, MCI etc.
3. The university shall give the details of regular faculty in the prospectus. Further the details of the entire faculty including contract/part time should be available alongwith their photos, qualification and bio-data in the official website of the university.

4. The deficiency of the faculty shall be fulfilled atleast one month before start of the course.
5. The infrastructure viz. computers, labs and other equipments shall be provided as per norms of the regulatory bodies and shall be available before the start of course.
6. In case any deficiency is observed at later stage, suitable action as per law shall be initiated against the university.
7. The tuition fee shall be charged annually, in two equal installments.
8. The Institutional Development Charges shall be Rs.10,000/- in each case for every university, to be charged annually.
9. The Caution Money for Hostel will be Rs.5,000/- and for university it will be Rs.10,000/- in each case for every university for the whole programme/ course. This fees will be refundable in nature.
10. The university shall charge the fees under the four heads as recommended by the committee and no other fees shall be charged by the university.
11. The university shall remain free to propose the add-on charges for special facilities/activities over and above those included in the list to be provided for specific students on optional basis from time to time, but for any facility which is provided to all the students of a programme there cannot be any add on charges for that.
12. The university will clearly categorize the fees for hostellers and non-hosteller as the case may be and the details thereof as approved by the Govt. shall be given in the prospectus.
13. The university shall encourage and implement all the welfare schemes applicable for the staff as well as students.
14. In no case shall the fee fixed by the committee exceed the proposed fee structure by the university. In case, it is detected it shall be suitably reduced.
15. If the university does not have sufficient faculty and infrastructure for running a course, the university can drop the idea of starting such courses.
16. If already charging less than approved tuition fee, same shall be continued. If charging more, excess be refunded.
17. If any university charges more than the fee approved, the Govt. will take action against the university.

18. If any course/degree/programme is not recognized by the UGC for which the fee has been approved the same shall not be deemed as approved.
19. Only the courses approved by the State Government be considered as the final approval of fees.
20. The fee structure approved for the year 2010-2011 shall not be applicable for this year if the courses are not approved by the Government for continuation.
21. The University shall credit upto one percent of the total fee in the name of the H.P. Private Educational Institutions Regulatory Commission every year as per the direction of the Commission under the provision of Section 8(a) of the Himachal Pradesh Private Educational Institutions (Regulatory Commission) Act, 2010.

Subject: Regarding approval of courses.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to Section 31(5) of the SRI SAI University(Establishment and Regulation) Act.

In this matter after examining the report of the inspection committee, you are directed to take following action in the matter:-

A) Existing Courses

i) With regard to all existing courses (i.e. courses for which approval was accorded vide this department letters of even number dated 28th June, 2011 and 5th December, 2011) for the academic year 2011-12 and made functional during 2011-12, the number of seats allocated for the academic session 2012-13 shall remain same and shall be subject to all conditions imposed by the Govt. in respect of these courses at the time of approval. It is reiterated that no student with just 10th Class qualification be offered admission to any course.

ii) The fee structure for all such approved courses which were made functional shall remain same for the academic session 2012-13, as approved during 2011-12 by the Government in respect of your University.

B) New Courses

1. In B.Com.(Professional) (with 60 seats), Ph.D. in Management (with 2 seats), you are allowed to undertake admission for 2012-2013 session on the following conditions:-

i) In these courses norms fixed by the concerned regulatory body may be strictly adhered to. If the course is not under any regulatory body then the standards adopted by the Government Universities will have to be followed.

ii) Recruitment of faculty for the proposed new intake of the students for the above courses, must be done, one month prior to the start of new session. Names of all the newly recruited faculty along-with their photos, qualifications and bio-data must be uploaded on your university website, one month prior to start of new session.

iii) Names of students who will join in the new session for these courses must be uploaded within fifteen days of the start of new session.

- iv) Necessary infrastructure, lab, library books etc. required for starting new courses must be in place prior to start of the new session.
- v) Ph.D. supervisors are on the regular rolls of the University and RDC is formed in Ph.D. courses as per UGC/Govt. norms.
2. For M.Sc.(Physics/Chemistry), the University is not possessing sufficient/proper labs as per the norms. Hence, approval for starting these courses for the session 2012-13 is not granted.
3. It is clarified that admission to any diploma courses can be made only for students having 10+2 qualification. No students shall be admitted to any course with just 10th Class qualification as this is not admissible under SRI SAI University(Establishment and Regulation) Act.
4. The fee structure for the new courses to be started w.e.f. 2012-13 shall be approved separately as per standing procedure in the appropriate committee.
5. Proposal of fee structure for the new courses for session 2012-13 may be submitted through the Member Secy.-cum- Addl. Director(Colleges) within a week time to the following address:-

- a. **The approval for new courses is on the specific condition that faculty and physical academic infrastructure must be in place before the issue of prospectus. The names and bio-data of the regular faculty available for each course along with details of physical academic infrastructure must find mention in the prospectus for the information of the students/general public. The details of the entire faculty including contract/ part time should also be available on the official website of the university.**
- b. In case the faculty norms are not met and physical academic infrastructure is not in place for the courses approved before issue of prospectus/advertisement, the university may defer the running of the course to next academic session after having requisite faculty/infrastructure and an intimation to this effect shall have to be sent to the Commission.
- d. In respect of the courses started, the university shall ensure the availability of full faculty strength and physical academic infrastructure based on approved intake as per norms. The university shall be required to supply a

copy of the course curriculum/syllabus in respect of all new courses to the Commission 15 days before the commencement of the programme.

IV. Courses for which prior approval of Regulatory body required

In respect of the following courses, the approval of the Regulatory body as indicated against each, be obtained by the university first:

The proposal for new courses where approval of Regulatory body like BCI/FCI/Others etc is required would be approved only after the receipt of approval from such Regulatory authorities.

The universities may submit the proposal(s) for fee fixation to the state government in respect of such courses preferably along-with proof of submission of proposal submitted to the Regulatory body so that the statutorily prescribed date i.e.31.12.2012 for submission of fee proposal could be met.

The university shall also apply for course approval to the Commission on receipt of approval from the Regulatory body.

V . M.Phil/Ph.D Programme

- a. Proposal for M.Phil/Ph.D is being considered separately.
- b. The University may submit proposal(s) for fee fixation to the state government in respect of such courses with proof as to the availability of faculty and lab so that the statutorily prescribed date i.e.31.12.2012 for submission of fee proposal could be met

Terms and conditions for running of the courses

The running of the existing as well as new courses is subject to the following terms and conditions:

- a. **The University shall observe the eligibility criteria, minimum standard of instructions and prescribed norms for the running of a course/programme/grant of degree which shall be imparted by a duly qualified teaching staff and appropriate academic physical infrastructure facilities as prescribed by the relevant regulatory bodies e.g UGC/AICTE/PCI/BCI etc.**
- b. The academic infrastructure and other facilities like labs, equipments and computers should be available as per norms of the relevant regulatory bodies by the time the prospectus is ready for issuance to the students.

- c. The availability of essential academic infrastructure like lab etc. for each course/programme must also find mention in the prospectus. The number of seats approved for each course along with seats reserved, approved fee structure, schedule of admission and admission criteria must interalia find mention in the prospectus.
- d. The nomenclature and duration of the course/degree/programme should conform to UGC/other regulatory bodies.
- e. The university shall ensure submission of requisite information to the UGC as required under Sections 3.7 & 3.8 of U.G.C. (Establishment and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003 which interalia requires sending of intimation to the U. G.C six months prior to starting of a new course. Where the U.G.C. inspection is overdue, the university shall ensure submission of requisite information to the U.G.C. in the prescribed format at the earliest so that inspection could take place.
- f. The basis for admission to B.Tech and MBA courses, shall be through JEE(Main) and CMAT respectively as per decision taken in the meeting held on 21.01.2012 and minutes circulated to all the private universities vide letter no. HPPER/31/Meeting/2012 dated 28.01.2012. The basis for admission for M.Tech would be as may be prescribed by the HP PERC.
- g. Where applicable, the university shall take appropriate steps for seeking course accreditation which will add to its credibility besides enhancing employability of the students-both nationally and internationally. The commission may be kept informed of the progress made in this regard from time to time.
- h. The University website shall be updated as per directions given from time to time by the Commission for information of students/general public. The information sought for by the Regulatory Commission regarding the functioning of the university including aspects like admission, student admitted, examinations; faculty and academic infrastructure etc must be furnished from time to time in the manner as required by the Regulatory Commission.
- i. Where the student's intake in any course is less than 20% of the sanctioned intake, the academic regulations of the University must provide option to student for migration, if not already existing.
- j. The University shall strictly comply with the UGC (Establishment and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities Regulations, 2003.

- k. Proposal for fee approval for the existing/ new courses for academic session 2013-14 need to be submitted to the State Government within the prescribed time frame in the manner as prescribed.
- l. If any information provided is found incorrect at any stage or the assurances provided regarding meeting the norms of faculty and infrastructure in respect of all courses or in the event of violation of standards of admission, charging of excess fees than approved or indulging in practices which are not in conformity with the prescribed regulations, the Commission reserves its right to withdraw the approval and take such action, as it may deem fit.

You are requested to take further necessary action in the matter and keep the Commission apprised of the same.

The names and bio-data of the regular faculty available for each course along with details of physical academic infrastructure must find mention in the prospectus for the information of the students, general public and State Government. The copy of the said prospectus be provided to the Department of Higher Education before starting of the academic session. The details of the entire faculty including contract/ part time should also be available in the official website of the University.
- b. the course approval is further subject to inspection by the Inspection Committee(s) to be constituted by the State Government. Such Committee(s) shall inter-alia examine the physical infrastructure and availability of manpower in relation to the course

approved. It shall be open to the State Government to withdraw the approval if any deficiencies are brought out by the Inspection Committee(s).

- c. the University shall observe the minimum standard of instructions and prescribed norms for the running of a course/ programme/ grant of degree which shall be imparted by a duly qualified teaching staff and appropriate academic physical infrastructure facilities as prescribed.
- d. the academic infrastructure and other facilities like labs, equipments and computers should be available as per norms of the regulatory bodies by the time the prospectus is ready for issuance to the students.
- e. the availability of academic infrastructure for each course/ programme must also find mention in the prospectus. The number of seats approved for each course along with seats reserved, approved fee structure, schedule of admission and intake criteria must inter-alia find mention in the website.
- f. if, any course(s)/ degree(s)/ programme(s) is being run or is/ are to be run by the University, which has/ have not been approved by the UGC/ other regulatory bodies, the same shall be liable for cancellation without any notice and no future correspondence in this regard will be entertained.
- g. the University shall ensure submission of requisite information to the UGC as required under Sections 3.7 & 3.8 of U.G.C. (Establishment and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulation, 2003 which inter-alia requires sending of intimation to the U.G.C six months prior to starting of a new course. Where the U.G.C. inspection is overdue, the University shall ensure submission of requisite information to the U.G.C. in the prescribed format at the earliest so that inspection could take place.
- h. the eligibility and admission criteria for admission to the above courses shall be as prescribed by the State Government vide notification(s) No. EDN.(TE)A(1)-9/2012 dated 16/03/2013 & dated 03/04/2013; Letter no. EDN-A-Ka(9)-2/2012-Loose dated 08/04/2013; EDN(TE)A(9)1/2012 dated 29/11/2013 and notification No. EDN-Ka(9)-2/2012-Loose dated 24/03/2014 and EDN-A-Ka(9)-2/2012-Loose dated 26/03/2014. Admissions, if any, made in violation of the prescribed norms fixed vide notification(s)/ letter(s) referred to above, shall be invalid and degrees awarded to such candidates shall not be recognised by the State Government besides attracting action as may be called for.
- i. the University shall take appropriate steps for seeking course accreditation which will add to its credibility besides enhancing employability of the students- both nationally and internationally. The Department of Higher Education may be kept informed of the progress made in this regard from time to time.
- j. the University website shall be updated and information as required about the University & its functioning for the general public is uploaded on the University's website from time to time. The information sought for by the Department of Higher Education regarding admission, student admitted, examinations; faculty and academic infrastructure etc must be furnished from time to time in the manner as required by Department of Higher Education.

- k. where the student's intake in any course is less than 20% of the sanctioned intake, the academic regulations of the University must provide option to student for migration, if not already existing.
- l. the University shall strictly comply with the UGC (Establishment and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulation, 2003.
- m. if any information provided is found incorrect at any stage or the assurances provided regarding meeting the norms of faculty and infrastructure in respect of all courses or in the event of violation of standards of admission, charging of excess fees than approved or indulging in practices which are not in conformity with the prescribed regulations, the State Govt. reserves its right to withdraw the approval and take such action, as it may deem fit.

You are requested to take further necessary action in the matter and keep the Department of Higher Education apprised of the same.
